COVID 19 UPDATE - The provincial government announced that beginning Tuesday, Sept 21 at 11:59 p.m. people will be required to show proof of vaccination when accessing certain events, services and businesses. We feel that First United would fall into the category of "indoor organized gatherings including weddings, funerals..." and therefore we "must ask to see proof of vaccination" from all patrons who are 12 and older. Individuals who are unable to receive a vaccine due to a medical exemption will be required to show proof. Proof of vaccination may be provided by showing an immunization record or a photograph of an immunization record from a regional health authority clinic, pharmacy, public health or MyHealthNB portal.

Jeremiah 4:23-28

- 23 I looked on the earth, and lo, it was waste and void; and to the heavens, and they had no light.
- 24 I looked on the mountains, and lo, they were quaking, and all the hills moved to and fro.
- 25 I looked, and lo, there was no one at all, and all the birds of the air had fled.
- 26 I looked, and lo, the fruitful land was a desert, and all its cities were laid in ruins before the Lord, before his fierce anger.
- 27 For thus says the Lord: The whole land shall be a desolation; yet I will not make a full end.
- 28 Because of this the earth shall mourn, and the heavens above grow black; for I have spoken, I have purposed; I have not relented nor will I turn back.
