

COVID 19 UPDATE – To do our part in keeping the community and our church family as safe as possible, effective September 22, 2021, anyone 12 years or older will be asked to show proof of being fully vaccinated (two doses) or medically exempt when entering the church building. We'll read together Canadian Senator (Retired) Hugh Segal's recent book: <u>Bootstraps Need Boots; One Tory's Lonely</u> <u>Fight To End Poverty in Canada (UBC Press, Vancouver, 2019</u>.

Everything Has Its Time

1 For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:
