We'll read together Canadian Senator (Retired) Hugh Segal's recent book: <u>Bootstraps Need Boots;</u> One Tory's Lonely Fight To End Poverty in Canada (UBC Press, Vancouver, 2019.

The four Zoom sessions are to be held on Wednesdays, <u>January 12, 19, 26</u> and <u>February 2 at 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. Atlantic Time (7:30 to 9 NL Time.)</u> Each session will be $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours duration. Meetings will be hosted by Marion Pardy (NL), Karen & Hal Llewlellyn (NS), Audrey Lounder and Rose-Hannah Gaskin (NB).

LUKE 1:68-79

- "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them.
- He has raised up a mighty savior for us in the house of his servant David,
- as he spoke through the mouth of his holy prophets from of old,
- that we would be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us.

LUKE 3:1-6

- In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene,
- during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness.
