
<u>Please Note</u> - In an effort to assist the Bathurst Volunteer Center, should you wish to make a monetary donation you may now do so by **issuing your cheque to First United Church**, indicating it is to be used for the purchase of Peanut Butter. Your donation will be marked as such and will be included on your annual tax receipt. Your cheques can be dropped off at the church office or mailed to 309 St. Patrick Street, Bathurst NB E2A 1E2. Periodically someone from our Community Outreach Team will purchase the peanut butter and have it delivered directly to the Volunteer Center.

Update for in-person services — We are returning to in-person services on Sunday, February 20th. Anyone 5 years of age or older will be asked to show proof of being fully vaccinated (two doses) or medically exempt when entering the church building. This practice will continue for Sunday services and those visiting the Church office and buildings during the week, until further notice. SCRIPTURE READINGS – NEW REVISED STANDARD VERSION

JEREMIAH 17:5-10

- 5 Thus says the Lord: Cursed are those who trust in mere mortals and make mere flesh their strength, whose hearts turn away from the Lord.
- 6 They shall be like a shrub in the desert, and shall not see when relief comes. They shall live in the parched places of the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land.
- 7 Blessed are those who trust in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord.
- 8 They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit.

- 20 Then he looked up at his disciples and said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.
- 21 "Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. "Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.
- 22 "Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man.
- 23 Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.
- 24 "But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation.
- 25 "Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. "Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep.
- 26 "Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.
