

## Church News

**Peanut Butter Update** - As of April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022, **92** jars of Peanut Butter have been collected to go to the Bathurst Volunteer Center and an additional **106** jars have been dropped off directly at the Centre from the monetary donations made at the church office. Peanut butter can be dropped off at the church office anytime during office hours. We have an additional \$420 collected for the next group purchase.

Should you wish to make a monetary donation you may now do so by **issuing your cheque to First United Church**, indicating it is to be used for the purchase of Peanut Butter. Your donation will be marked as such and will be included on your annual tax receipt. Your cheques can be dropped off at the church office or mailed to 309 St. Patrick Street, Bathurst NB E2A 1E2. Periodically someone from our Community Outreach Team will purchase the peanut butter and have it delivered directly to the Volunteer Center.

**The Land Acknowledgement Sub-team** of the Christian Development Team (CD Team) at First United has been hard at work over the past two years; researching Social Action themes important to our Community of Faith.

In 2015, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada published a list of 94 Calls to Action. One of these called for Churches to respond.

"We call upon all religious organizations and faith groups who have not already done so to repudiate concepts used to justify European sovereignty over Indigenous lands and peoples, such as the Doctrine of Discovery and terra nullis." Call to Action #49

## Lenten Challenges

Today is the sixth Sunday in Lent. Each week during Lent this year, a Lenten challenge has been offered. After speaking the words, a symbol of the challenge and a sign with the challenge written on it will be placed on the table.



The first week, we asked everyone to do a random act of generosity.

The second week, we asked everyone to express gratitude to someone they don't usually thank and to name three things for which they were grateful every day.





The third week we asked that you pray for an enemy or someone in your life you have been having difficulties with. Each day we asked you to pray for them or simply send them love and compassion.

The fourth week we asked that you share your faith with someone else. Tell them about your church, offer them a ride to the service or possibly buy them a ticket to the next supper – telling them it's just to remind them of God's presence.





Last week we asked that you call or visit someone who is lonely or alone. Someone you aren't usually in the habit of reaching out to – someone in the community or a stranger.

## SCRIPTURE READING – NEW REVISED STANDARD VERSION

## Luke 19:28-40

28 After he had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

29 When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples,

30 saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here.

31 If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it.'"

32 So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them.

33 As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?"

34 They said, "The Lord needs it."

35 Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it.

36 As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road.

37 As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen,

38 saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!"

39 Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop."

40 He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."

May God bless to our understanding this significant part of our Christian story...
