Bathurst Pastoral Council Highlights of meeting September 26, 2023

The Council meeting, held in the Ruth Morrison Room, opened with our land acknowledgement and a prayer by Rev. Neal Palmer. Sandra Boone convened the meeting as chair.

First United's Planned Giving Program through Wills and Bequests has sparked the faith and generosity of one of its members. As revealed in the Finance Team report, a \$10,000 bequest was made to the General Fund from an estate. An additional \$10,000 bequest from the same source was directed to the East Bathurst Cemetery on Bridge Street.

It was at the last Council meeting in May that the decision was made to name a Stewardship Team with focus being on planned giving. Named as team members were Dave Brewster, Brenda Parrott, Bruce Chamberlain and Rev. Neal Palmer.

The 2023 income statement as of August 31st showed a deficit of \$10,583, the recent bequest included.

Church treasurer, Dave Morison, said First United has actually received four bequests over the past year and a half.

Bill Stack, chair of Hospitality and Friendship, said he was pleased with the help received for fellowship time during the summer.

A report was given on May's Regional Council Annual Meeting (formerly Maritime Conference) which was attended by delegates Martha Vickers, Rev. Neal and Jini Palmer. Introduced during the meeting in Charlottetown were five candidates for Ordered Ministry, one Diaconal Ministry candidate and one Designated Lay Ministry student. Also, five new ministers were welcomed.

Reporting for Ways and Means, Wayne Lord said all 330 tickets for the Roast Beef BBQ Take-out were sold. He expressed special thanks to Ray Lavigne for the beef preparation coupled with the generous financial donation by the Hatheway Group net proceeds otaled \$4,791.62.

Lester Scott, chair of Property Management, reported that the Bathurst Community Market in the Donald Eddy Memorial Hall on Saturday mornings was going "really well" and with congregation support.

Brenda Parrott, head of the Christian Development Team said since Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday, there will be the usual morning service with communion, and a children's service later that day at 4:00 PM.

Council members and guests were pleased to receive the dinner invitation from Sandra and Ed Boone earlier this fall. Sandra is chair of the Pastoral Council.

The next Council meeting was set for Tuesday, November 14th.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

JOSHUA 3:7-17

- 7 The Lord said to Joshua, "This day I will begin to exalt you in the sight of all Israel, so that they may know that I will be with you as I was with Moses.
- 8 You are the one who shall command the priests who bear the ark of the covenant, 'When you come to the edge of the waters of the Jordan, you shall stand still in the Jordan."
- 9 Joshua then said to the Israelites, "Draw near and hear the words of the Lord your God."
- 10 Joshua said, "By this you shall know that among you is the living God who without fail will drive out from before you the Canaanites, Hittites, Hivites, Perizzites, Girgashites, Amorites, and Jebusites:
- 11 the ark of the covenant of the Lord of all the earth is going to pass before you into the Jordan.
- 12 So now select twelve men from the tribes of Israel, one from each tribe.
- 13 When the soles of the feet of the priests who bear the ark of the Lord, the Lord of all the earth, come to rest in the waters of the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan flowing from above shall be cut off; they shall stand in a single heap."
- 14 When the people set out from their tents to cross over the Jordan, the priests bearing the ark of the covenant were in front of the people.
- 15 Now the Jordan overflows all its banks throughout the time of harvest. So when those who bore the ark had come to the Jordan and the feet of the priests bearing the ark were dipped in the edge of the water,
- 16 the waters flowing from above stood still, rising up in a single heap far off at Adam, the city that is beside Zarethan, while those flowing toward the sea of the Arabah, the Dead Sea, were wholly cut off. Then the people crossed over opposite Jericho.

17 While all Israel were crossing over on dry ground, the priests who bore the ark of the covenant of the Lord stood firmly on dry ground in the middle of the Jordan, until the entire nation finished crossing over the Jordan.

MATTHEW 23:1-12

- 1 Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples,
- 2 "The scribes and the Pharisees sit on Moses's seat;
- 3 therefore, do whatever they teach you and follow it, but do not do as they do, for they do not practice what they teach.
- 4 They tie up heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay them on the shoulders of others, but they themselves are unwilling to lift a finger to move them.
- 5 They do all their deeds to be seen by others, for they make their phylacteries broad and their fringes long.
- 6 They love to have the place of honor at banquets and the best seats in the synagogues
- 7 and to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and to have people call them rabbi.
- 8 But you are not to be called rabbi, for you have one teacher, and you are all brothers and sisters.
- 9 And call no one your father on earth, for you have one Father, the one in heaven.
- 10 Nor are you to be called instructors, for you have one instructor, the Messiah.
- 11 The greatest among you will be your servant.
- 12 All who exalt themselves will be humbled, and all who humble themselves will be exalted.

May God bless to our understanding these significant parts of our Christian story...
