An ordained United Church clergy person, Ellie came to NB after several years serving as chaplain in Concordia University, Quebec. As Ellie and her partner have settled into Maritime life, Ellie is happy to share that they recently installed solar panels and are excited to watch the first pictures of energy transformation.

Ellie's face shines as she talks about her passion for the ministry at Mt. Allison. The walls of the chapel reflect that same light with inter-faith symbols from around the world. Those of you with fond memories of studying at Mt A will be amazed at the transformation.

Ellie explained how "Whenever there is a crisis anywhere in the world, it becomes very personal right here on campus." Be it Sudan, the Philippines, Ukraine, Russia or Gaza and Israel, when violence erupts or tragedy strikes, hearts ache at Mt. Allison. On campus, the crisis is not some distant story, for indeed the sadness and fear draw close.

Ellie sits, listens and tries to hold a sacred and safe space for all. I am grateful for Ellie's campus ministry and all such ministries across the region.



Part One (1-7)

Give heed to my teaching, O my people, turn your ears to the words of my mouth.

- **1** 'Then the kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom.
- 2 Five of them were foolish, and five were wise.
- **3** When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them;
- **4** but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps.
- **5** As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept.
- **6** But at midnight there was a shout, "Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him."
- **7** Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps.
- **8** The foolish said to the wise, "Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out."
- **9** But the wise replied, "No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves."
- **10** And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut.
- **11** Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, "Lord, lord, open to us."
- 12 But he replied, "Truly I tell you, I do not know you."
- 13 Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.
