



SCRIPTURE READINGS

GENESIS 1:1-5

1 When God began to create the heavens and the earth,

2 the earth was complete chaos, and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters.

3 Then God said, "Let there be light," and there was light.

4 And God saw that the light was good, and God separated the light from the darkness.

5 God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

MARK 1:4-11

4 so John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

5 And the whole Judean region and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him and were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins.
