

West Bathurst Cemetery Committee Report

The West Bathurst Cemetery Committee is responsible for the West Bathurst Cemetery on St. Anne Street and the St. Luke's "Old Scottish" Cemetery on St. Luke's Court.

As of December 31, 2015, the "Endowment Fund" balance was \$55,015.00 and the general operating fund was \$8,817.01 for a total of \$63,832.01. The "Endowment Fund" is set up so that only interest generated can be used. We are thankful to everyone who continues to support this fund through PAR and donations.

We have a number of projects that we hope to complete in 2016. Trees and bushes along the boundary of West Bathurst Cemetery and the railroad line will be trimmed or removed. The straightening of gravestones will also continue. A load of topsoil is needed to level a number of graves. Many of the gravestones at St. Luke's Cemetery were vandalized over the years, so we hope to be able to repair a number of these each year.

Refugee Sponsorship Committee Update

As the liaison between the Miramichi Presbytery Refugee Sponsorship Committee & local UCC congregations, I am happy to report that our refugee family is well settled in their new home, an apartment in Miramichi. They arrived on February 12th & during the past month, committee members have been busy, making sure that the newcomers are well informed about all aspects of life in Canada. A translator has helped immensely with communication.

The young couple with 2 active toddler boys is so grateful to be here & for the generosity of our congregations. The parents (Marwan & Wafaa) attend language classes from 9AM-3PM (Monday – Friday) at the Multicultural Association office, while the boys (Murad & Mohammad) are at day care, providing exposure to other children, speaking English. The adults have had dental issues addressed & the most recent news is that Wafaa is pregnant!

Fundraising efforts throughout our presbytery have been supportive & to date, \$23,000 has accumulated. Gift cards & monetary contributions may be donated though our church office &will be relayed to the sponsorship committee. Meanwhile, preparations for the second family are ongoing.
