Suicide Prevention Month

Why Do People Suicide?

Suicide is a complex issue involving numerous factors and should not be attributed to any one single cause. Not all people who die by suicide have been diagnosed with a mental illness and not all people with a mental illness attempt to end their lives by suicide.

People who experience suicidal thoughts and feelings are suffering with tremendous emotional pain. People who have died by suicide typically had overwhelming feelings of hopelessness, despair, and helplessness. Suicide is not about a moral weakness or a character flaw. People considering suicide feel as though their pain will never end and that suicide is the only way to stop the suffering.

Many factors and circumstances can contribute to someone's decision to end his/her life. Factors such as loss, addictions, childhood trauma or other forms of trauma, depression, serious physical illness, and major life changes can make some people feel overwhelmed and unable to cope. It is important to remember that it isn't necessarily the nature of the loss or stressor that is as important as the individual's experience of these things feeling unbearable.

Suicide is Complex:

Suicide is the result of actions taken to deal with intolerable mental anguish and pain, fear or despair that overwhelms an individual's value for living and hope in life. While there is a well-established link between suicide and depression, each suicide occurs in a unique mix of complex interconnected factors, individual, environmental, biological, psychological, social, cultural, historical, political and spiritual, including psychological trauma (both developmental and intergenerational).

Miramichi Presbytery 'Church in Action' Report: Syrian Family - 2nd Anniversary Up-date

On Feb 11th 2016 the Albboud family (Marwan, Wafaa, Murad & Hamoudi) arrived in Canada. One day later they arrived in Moncton. By that evening they were settled into their new home. The ladies still talk of the tears in Wafaa's eyes upon seeing the decorated and well-stocked apartment, dining room and all.

Since that time we have welcomed their daughter Alisar (Oct. 19 '16). Though it's a different era, their transition has given us a glimpse into what it must have been like for our ancestors. Like them, they miss family but know Canada is where they will find a better life.

The kids are smart and loveable. Murad recently completed some speech therapy. He begins kindergarten in September. Three-year-old Hamoudi, like his brother, understands Arabic but answers in English. Alisar is walking and babbling, full of energy and spunk.

Dad continues to take language classes in conjunction with a construction skills program. Once mom's reading and writing skills improve, she will enter the two-year Human Services course at NBCC. Wafaa is also working on a Driver's Ed course in advance of the on-road training.

The second phase of the Presbytery's initiative is ongoing. We had to follow the private sponsorship model. Now with an immigration number, our second family joins thousands of others awaiting a call. ETA is sometime later this year.

Our committee has established a target budget of \$45,000 (min). Thanks to fellow presbytery member Irvin Carmichael and Presbytery we now have \$40,000. We discussed this at Presbytery and have agreed **not** to solicit funds from our members and churches. Your support of two years ago was remarkable. Thanks again!

We have left the door open to individuals, businesses or specific groups in congregations, **of their own volition**, to donate to the initiative. Speak to your presbytery rep or clergy for further information.
