God's Love and Ours

- ⁷ Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God.
- ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love.
- ⁹ This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him.
- ¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.
- ¹¹ Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.
- ¹² No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.
- 13 This is how we know that we live in him and he in us: He has given us of his Spirit.
- ¹⁴ And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world.
- 15 If anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God lives in them and they in God.
- $^{\rm 16}\,{\rm And}$ so we know and rely on the love God has for us.

God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them.

- ¹⁷ This is how love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment: In this world we are like Jesus.
- ¹⁸ There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love.
- ¹⁹ We love because he first loved us.
- ²⁰ Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen.
- ²¹ And he has given us this command: Anyone who loves God must also love their brother and sister.

The Vine and the Branches

15 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener.

- ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes^[a] so that it will be even more fruitful.
- ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you.
- ⁴Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.
- ⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.
- ⁶ If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned.
- 7 If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you.
- ⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.
