Bathurst Pastoral Council May 30, 2017

Council met in the Eddy Room at 4 p.m. with Sandra Boone presiding. Also in attendance were Brenda Parrott, vice-chair; Judy Losier, secretary; Wayne Lord, Linda Newell, Don Nelson, Ian Oliver, Rick Watling, Anne Brooks, Isabel MacLaggan and Rev. Blair Lewis who opened with prayer.

Rev. Lewis reported on his attendance at the Maritime Conference annual meeting in Sackville last week. He said one of the special speakers was Rev. John Young, originally of Douglaston in our Presbytery and Conference. He joined the General Council staff in Toronto last year.

Miramichi Presbytery has given its approval for roof replacement at First United, such approval being necessary since the project exceeds a \$5,000 expenditure.

On the same subject, Don Nelson of the Property Management Team said two quotes for new roof shingles have been received and a few others are expected. The \$20,000 in the reserve Repair Fund will be used and donations towards this major project will be sought, it was decided at Monday's Finance meeting.

As the Financial Management Chair, Ian Oliver reported finances as of May 31 on budget. The figures show that without the recent \$2,000 from the UCW, the resulting amount would have been under budget.

Mission and Service givings stand at \$7,004 as of May 31 about \$500 below budget. The Ways and Means projects netted about \$800 over what was budgeted for the five month period while the Memorial Hymn Sing (\$5524) and other fundraising (\$2515) realized slightly more than projected.

Anne Brooks, who attended as the UCW representative on Council for the first time, said Margaret Demmings has succeeded Elna Scott as UCW president. Wilma Dempsey is the treasure and Anne is the secretary. Tribute was paid to Lillian Jagoe at the April UCW meeting. She was the treasurer for many years prior to her recent death.

The Board of Trustees reported that insurance coverage on the church properties for 2017-2018 will cost \$8,669, exactly the same as last year.

Wayne Lord said about 70 people attended the thank-you luncheon hosted by the Ways and Means Committee on Sunday, May 21 not counting the 12 committee members.

Brenda Parrott reported the Chicken Take-Out on May 26 was a success. What was left was taken to a care home on St. Anne Street.

The Christian Development Team is happy with the two 6-week Sunday School sessions held prior to Christmas and Easter. Jennifer Oliver-Lavigne will not be available as Sunday School superintendent in the fall, it was reported.

Nominations Chair Rick Watling is seeking a chairperson of the Hospitality and Friendship Team. Also he said volunteers for the after-service hospitality time would be most welcome even for a one-Sunday stint during the summer.

The Pastoral Care Team sent 21 greeting and sympathy cards during the past month. Mention was made that both Bert Demmings and Dorothy Bond are celebrating 98th birthdays this spring.

Reporting for the Communications Sub-Team, Isabel MacLaggan mentioned the Easter Newsletter, the two bulletin boards, and highlights of the Pastoral Council and Miramichi Presbytery meetings which were included in church bulletins and posted on the bulletin boards.

It was reported that the art work project for the Donald Eddy Memorial Hall is underway. Marie Oliver and Adrienne Hazen offered to create wall panels which would incorporate the history and past activities. They will be placed on the west wall.

It was agreed that the church office will be closed all day Friday during June, July and August rather than on Monday as was the arrangement last year. This change was requested by Isabel Clouston and Alan Wilcox who are involved and who wish to be compensated for their overtime hours in this way, it was stated.

The next Council meeting was set for Tuesday September 26.
