- ⁵³ Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.
- ⁵⁴ Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day.
- ⁵⁵ For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.
