# **Exodus 34:29-35 New Revised Standard Version (NRSV)**

# **The Shining Face of Moses**

- <sup>29</sup> Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant<sup>[a]</sup> in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God.
- <sup>30</sup> When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him.
- <sup>31</sup> But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them.
- <sup>32</sup> Afterward all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the LORD had spoken with him on Mount Sinai.
- <sup>33</sup> When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face;
- <sup>34</sup> but whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded,
- <sup>35</sup> the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

# The Transfiguration

- <sup>28</sup> Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus<sup>[a]</sup> took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray.
- <sup>29</sup> And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white.
- <sup>30</sup> Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him.
- <sup>31</sup> They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem.
- <sup>32</sup> Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, <sup>[b]</sup> they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him.
- <sup>33</sup> Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, <sup>[c]</sup> one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah"—not knowing what he said.
- <sup>34</sup> While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud.
- <sup>35</sup> Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; [d] listen to him!"
- <sup>36</sup> When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.
