Tier Payment

Tier I more closely accounts for the true costs of running the program (\$295)

Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem

- ²⁸ After he had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.
- ²⁹ When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples,
- 30 saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here.
- ³¹ If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it."'
