Taking Sides in the Church

- ¹⁰ Brothers and sisters, I make my appeal to you. I do this in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. I ask that all of you agree with one another in what you say. I ask that you don't take sides. I ask that you are in complete agreement in all that you think.
- ¹¹ My brothers and sisters, I have been told you are arguing with one another. Some people from Chloe's house have told me this.
- ¹² Here is what I mean. One of you says, "I follow Paul." Another says, "I follow Apollos." Another says, "I follow Peter." And still another says, "I follow Christ."
- ¹³ Does Christ take sides? Did Paul die on the cross for you? Were you baptized in the name of Paul?
- $^{14}\,\mathrm{I}$ thank God that I didn't baptize any of you except Crispus and Gaius.
- ¹⁵ No one can say that you were baptized in my name.
- 16 It's true that I also baptized those who live in the house of Stephanas. Besides that, I don't remember if I baptized anyone else.
- ¹⁷ Christ did not send me to baptize. He sent me to preach the good news. He commanded me not to preach with wisdom and fancy words. That would take all the power away from the cross of Christ.

¹⁸ The message of the cross seems foolish to those who are lost and dying. But it is God's power to us who are being saved.

Jesus Begins to Preach

- ¹² John had been put in prison. When Jesus heard about this, he returned to Galilee.
- ¹³ Jesus left Nazareth and went to live in the city of Capernaum. It was by the lake in the area of Zebulun and Naphtali.
- ¹⁴ In that way, what the prophet Isaiah had said came true. He had said,
- ¹⁵ "Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali! Galilee, where Gentiles live! Land along the Mediterranean Sea! Territory east of the Jordan River!
- The people who are now living in darkness have seen a great light.
 They are now living in a very dark land.
 But a light has shined on them." (Isaiah 9:1,2)
- 17 From that time on Jesus began to preach. "Turn away from your sins!" he said. "The kingdom of heaven has come near."

- ¹⁸ One day Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee. There he saw two brothers, Simon Peter and his brother Andrew. They were throwing a net into the lake, because they were fishermen.
- 19 "Come and follow me," Jesus said. "I will send you out to fish for people." 20 At once they left their nets and followed him.
- ²¹ Going on from there, he saw two other brothers. They were James, son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat with their father Zebedee. As they were preparing their nets, Jesus called out to them.
