# The LORD's Case Against Israel

6 Listen to what the LORD says:

- "Stand up, plead my case before the mountains; let the hills hear what you have to say.
- <sup>2</sup> "Hear, you mountains, the LORD's accusation; listen, you everlasting foundations of the earth.
- For the LORD has a case against his people; he is lodging a charge against Israel.

# Matthew 5:1-12 New International Version (NIV) Introduction to the Sermon on the Mount

5 Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, <sup>2</sup> and he began to teach them.

The Beatitudes
