Bathurst Pastoral Council January 28, 2020

As Council Chair, Sandra Boone called the meeting to order at 4:00pm. It was the first meeting of the new year. Rev. Neal Palmer led in prayer.

In correspondence, Council received notification from Isabel Clouston, office administrator, of her planned retirement the end of June, 2020. Anyone interested in applying or wanting more information should contact Wayne Lord, chair of Ministry and Personnel.

Also in correspondence, Rev. Roger Janes, Regional Council Minister of Stewardship, said he will be giving a workshop at First United. The workshop, set for Saturday, April 25, is intended for the former Miramichi Presbytery area.

The year-end financial report, submitted by Treasurer Dave Morison, showed that over-budget revenue of \$7,008, combined with fewer expenditures, resulted in a better 2019 picture than expected. Two major reasons for the revenue increase over budget were \$2500 more received in rent (election and new renters) and a larger special offering at Christmas. The Christmas offering of \$7,327 was more than \$4000 above 2018.

The monthly local givings were over budget by \$1,239. The 2019 Mission and Service allocation of \$18,000 was met. Expense savings of \$6,500, compared to what was budgeted, included pension expenses (\$2,100) moving expenses (\$2,000) and \$2,400 in other net costs. Team chair is Ian Oliver.

The UCW set aside \$300 for outreach projects which may arise through the Community Outreach Sub-team. An amount of \$2000 has been included in the 2020 UCW budget for the General Fund and \$1000 for Mission and Service, Anne Brooks reported.

Nominations for the working teams are being accepted with some new people volunteering already according to Rick Watling. Brenda Parrott, chair of Christian Development, reported that Glen Ferguson, a sound engineer, has been consulted by the Property Management Team concerning an upgrade of the sound system. The CD Team discussed an initiative that would acknowledge treaties and traditional territories of First Nations. More information will be gathered.

The Pastoral Care and Membership Team reported that more than 80 Christmas cards were sent to seniors and shut-ins. A special monetary gift was given in some instances rather than the gift bags that were prepared last Christmas. Team Chair, Pat Brown, said a St. Patricks's concert and singalong will be held March 17.

The Community Outreach Sub-team served a Christmas breakfast to 17 people including the students and teachers downstairs, Church staff and Sub-team volunteers. The event was organized by Helen and Mick Knowles and Marie Oliver contributed Christmas favors for the gift bags.

White Gift donations totalled \$1555 apart from 278 items of various kinds. This was a significant increase over the last few years.

Reporting for the Property Management Team, Peter Gammon said the church and hall structures are in `pretty good shape` but a lot of inhouse work continues to be done on a regular basis.

Wayne Lord said all staff reviews except one have been carried out by the Ministry and Personnel Team.

The annual meeting of First United was set for Sunday, February 16 following the church service. The next Council meeting will be held on March 24.

True Fasting

58 "Shout it aloud, do not hold back. Raise your voice like a trumpet.Declare to my people their rebellion and to the descendants of Jacob their sins.

² For day after day they seek me out; they seem eager to know my ways, as if they were a nation that does what is right and has not forsaken the commands of its God.
They ask me for just decisions and seem eager for God to come near them.

³ 'Why have we fasted,' they say, 'and you have not seen it?
Why have we humbled ourselves, and you have not noticed?'

"Yet on the day of your fasting, you do as you please and exploit all your workers.

⁴ Your fasting ends in quarreling and strife, and in striking each other with wicked fists.
You cannot fast as you do today and expect your voice to be heard on high.

⁵ Is this the kind of fast I have chosen, only a day for people to humble themselves?
Is it only for bowing one's head like a reed and for lying in sackcloth and ashes?
Is that what you call a fast, a day acceptable to the LORD?
