## SCRIPTURE READING – NEW REVISED STANDARD VERSION

### Isaiah 65:17-25 - The Glorious New Creation

- 17** For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth;  
the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind.
- 18** But be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating;  
for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy,  
and its people as a delight.
- 19** I will rejoice in Jerusalem, and delight in my people;  
no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it,  
or the cry of distress.
- 20** No more shall there be in it an infant that lives but a few days,  
or an old person who does not live out a lifetime;  
for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth,  
and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed.
- 21** They shall build houses and inhabit them;  
they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit.

on all my holy mountain, says the LORD.
