

#### DEUTERONOMY 26:1-11

1 When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it,

2 you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name.

3 You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, "Today I declare to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us."

4 When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God,

5 you shall make this response before the Lord your God: "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous.

6 When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us,

7 we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression.

8 The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders;

9 and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey.

10 So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me." You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God.

11 Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house.

To all Communities of Faith in Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Regional Council:

On Friday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022, tropical storm Fiona slammed into the Atlantic Provinces. Parts of our provinces experienced torrential rain and winds of up to 160km/h (99mph), with trees and power-lines felled, houses washed into the sea, and dune systems completely destroyed. Hundreds of thousands of people were left without power for days and, even as I write this letter, there are approximately 9,000 households on Prince Edward Island who are still without power.

When I was able to venture out into the community, it was scene after scene of complete devastation. Some roads were completely impassable and had to be opened up with bulldozers. I saw some homes completely moved from their foundations, one had moved all the way onto the main road and the double yellow line was going into the front door. I saw barns whose entire sides had been ripped away and telephone poles snapped in two.

As we move into Thanksgiving we are very mindful that we have endured a lot over the past couple of years. We have endured the challenges of COVID. Our native communities are reeling over the discovery of hundreds of unmarked graves at former residential school sites across Canada. Here, in PEI, we have had the challenges of potato wart and its effects on our industry and our households. We are still picking up the pieces of tropical storm Fiona while inflation is hurting our pocketbooks, eroding the savings of our seniors, and overwhelming lower-income households with already tight budgets. Meanwhile, the war in the Ukraine still rages on. With all that we have faced and continue to face, the question is, "Can we be thankful during these times?"

My friends, we live in a broken world and we have faced, and will continue to face, life's storms. Yet when we do, be mindful as to who is the Master of the Storm.

In Mark 6, Jesus sent the disciples ahead of Him to Bethsaida while He went off by Himself to pray. It wasn't a long trip by boat, but a great tempest suddenly came up and they were blown off course by a storm. When Jesus saw them struggling against the wind in the middle of the lake, He came to their aid.

Does your life feel like the disciples' today? Are you struggling? Are you about to give up? Have you been blown off course by the storms life has brought our way and you're wondering, "Can I survive?"

What does Jesus do when you're at your moment of desperation? Mark 6:48 says, **"About three o'clock in the morning Jesus came toward them, walking on the water"** (NLT). Notice that He didn't tell the disciples to come to Him. He knew they were so overwhelmed by the storm that they couldn't. So, He went to them instead.



The same is true for you. When you're at your point of desperation, Jesus comes to you!

I love the fact that Jesus did not stand on the shore and shout instructions. When you're in a storm, you don't need advice. You need a miracle! You need somebody to show up, and that's what Jesus did. He intervened in the disciples' storm. This is the Gospel: God doesn't stand on the shoreline telling you what to do; instead, He comes out and meets you in your own storm—in your pain, fear, depression, and discouragement. He comes to you.

How can you look to Jesus in the midst of a storm? The Bible says, *"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever"* (Hebrews 13:8 NIV). In the midst of all this change, you can count on that truth. You can also know that God's love for you and your community has never changed. God's call on your life hasn't changed; He is still asking us to love our neighbours as ourselves. Don't let all the changes make you lose sight of everything that is still the same.

You may feel abandoned right now, but you're not. The Bible says in John 14:18, *"I will not abandon you or leave you as orphans in the storm—I will come to you"* (TLB).

Maybe because of where you are, or perhaps good planning, or just plain luck, Fiona passed you by or left you relatively unscathed. If that is the case, I encourage you to turn your mind to our New Creed which says *We are not alone, we live in God's world. We believe in God who … works in us and others by the Spirit*. I encourage you to open yourself to the Spirit and allow God to work through you. When a person is in the midst of a storm they don't need advice, they need a miracle. They need somebody to show up, and that's what Jesus did. He intervened in the disciples' storm … and if you open yourself to the Spirit, so can you … you can be their miracle.

First Corinthians 12:26 NIV says *"If one part suffers, every part suffers with it"* Community is God's answer to despair. Romans 12:15 expresses a similar idea: *"Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn"* (NIV). When someone is going through a crisis, they don't want advice; they often just want somebody to sit with them, hold their hand, put an arm around their shoulder, or cry with them. They want someone simply to be with them. Sometimes the best kind of encouragement is just sitting in silence, waiting and weeping with a friend.

Paul says, *"Therefore encourage one another and build each other up"* (1 Thessalonians 5:11 NIV). That encouragement can take many forms. It can be a phone call, a meal delivered, an invite for coffee, an offer to run errands, or yard work done. We are all blessed with different skills and abilities. Whatever yours are, use them to encourage someone and build them up.

My friends, we have faced a lot this year and it has been overwhelming but still we gather ... in church ... with friends and family ... and we remember that no matter what we have faced ... and no matter what we will face ... that in life, in death, in life beyond death, that God is with us. We are not alone. Thanks be to God.
