



Highlights of Bathurst Pastoral Council Meeting December 1, 2022

With Sandra Boone presiding, others present were Brenda Parrott, vice-chair; Judy Losier, secretary; Dave Morison, church treasurer; Wayne Lord, Ian Oliver, Lester Scott, Martha Vickers, Rick Watling, Isabel MacLaggan and Rev. Neal Palmer, who opened with prayer.

The church's financial status, as presented by Dave, showed a 2022 deficit of \$11,807 to date. The budgeted deficit for this 11 month period was \$22,028 but two unexpected donations totalling \$13,500 helped to improve the financial picture.

Total revenue as of November 30 was \$213,753. Two Ways and Means takeout's resulted in \$18,370 of that revenue. Operating expenses amounted to \$225,561, partly due to an increased insurance premium this year and a drop in rental income.

Three monthly meetings of the Christian Development Team this fall revealed a busy schedule. With Brenda Parrott as chair, the team saw the return of the choir and after service fellowship, an eight week block of Sunday School sessions, six membership transfers, several baptisms, Holy Communions, installation of the sound system, land acknowledgment focus, and Advent preparation, in conjunction with Rev. Neal, among other responsibilities. Coming up are the Memorial Christmas Hymn Sing on Sunday afternoon, December 11 and two Christmas Eve services.

After four decades, the UCW at First United has disbanded. Funds, in the amount of \$3,942 were distributed to the Poinsettia Fund (\$500), peanut butter fundraiser (\$200), First United Endowment Fund (\$1500) and the balance directed to the Church's General Fund.

The Pastoral Care Team's December 1st meeting determined Christmas remembrances to shut-ins, seniors and others. Expressions of sympathy were sent to Rev. Keith Adams, his wife, Judy, and daughter, Haley whose 13 year old daughter Sophie passed away unexpectedly as the result of a sudden and serious illness.

Chaired by Lester Scott, the November meeting of the Property Management Team dealt with many items including the installation of the sound/video system, rentals, new windows and outdoor lights, the energy consumption audit, interior painting and other improvement, installations and repairs.

Ways and Means Chair Wayne Lord reported on a successful turkey dinner takeout. He said new team members are welcome.

Martha Vickers provided executive minutes of the Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Regional Council, formerly known as the Maritime Conference. She said the annual meeting, May 26 – 28 next spring will be held at the University of Prince Edward Island rather than at Mount Allison at a considerable saving in expenses.

Nominations chair Rick Watling referred to the posting in the narthex regarding Council members for 2023. He encouraged new members to sign up and noted that one such person had offered already.

The next Council meeting was scheduled for February 2.
