

Bathurst Pastoral Council Highlights

The Bathurst Pastoral Council met on April 23, 2024. Chaired by Sandra Boone, the meeting was attended by Brenda Parrott, Bill Stack, Ian Oliver, Martha Vickers, Lester Scott, Isabel MacLaggan, Dave Morison, church treasurer, and Rev. Neal Palmer.

The meeting opened with the Land Acknowledgement and prayer.

The Ways & Means Team reported "healthy sales" for the February 25th breakfast with 200 or more attending. Printing 250 tickets for the next breakfast, perhaps in the fall, is being considered, a figure used pre-Covid times.

The busy team followed up with a successful pork dinner in late March. Both sit-down and take-out meals were served to 254 people. Such a dinner required up to 28 volunteers to help with cooking, serving and clean up.

Commenting on the self-insurance plan, initiated by national church to share the risk, Dave Morison said the saving was about \$2,000 going back to 2022.

Bill Stack recognized the lady volunteers who have been handling Hospitality and Friendship following Sunday services.

Martha Vickers and Rev. Neal gave on update on the annual meeting of Fundy St. Lawrence Dawning Waters Region, formerly embraced by Maritime Conference. It will be held in Charlottetown May 31^{st} to June 2^{nd} . Included in the weekend meeting is an exciting program for youth of grades 6 - 12.

Again, the Pastoral Care Team encouraged members of the church family to visit the shut-ins. It was stated that only in doing so do you realize how meaningful it is.

Among topics of discussion, the Christian Development Team dealt with Red Dress Sunday on May 5th, Confirmation Sunday, Graduation Sunday and Rev. Neal's last Sunday on June 30th. Lester Scott of the Property Management Team spoke about a major expenditure, that being a new automatic dishwasher to replace the 25-year-old machine which cannot be repaired. Other financial outlays listed were two heat pumps for the office section of the church and camera installation for protection purposes. The total cost is more than \$23,000 but the dishwasher and heat pump items, being of an energy efficient nature, have a 66 percent rebate available through the national church's Faithful Footprints Program.

Council was told that the cross country vote to establish an Autonomous Indigenous Church within the United Church of Canada favoured the proposal.

The March concert by the Treble Makers was well attended as was the two-day Music Festival in April. Both events were held in our First United Sanctuary, the first one organized by the Pastoral Care Team.

With the retirement of Peter Watling and Hayden Hatheway from the Board of Trustees, the two replacements named were Dave Brewster and Wayne Cormier.

ACTS 10:44-48

44 While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word.
