# *White Gift Sunday*

## *December 14<sup>th</sup>*

The tradition of White Gift Sunday has its roots in a small Methodist church in Ohio in 1904. What began as a humble way to reflect on the love and devotion of the giver and not the value of the gift has grown into today's white gift services in many churches across several denominations. The story is told that a minister's wife initiated the idea to solve the problem of inequity of gifts given at the Sunday school Christmas party. Instead of focusing on receiving gifts, the focus shifted to bringing gifts to Jesus that could in turn be shared with people around the world who did not have much. All the gifts would come wrapped in plain white paper, so that no one would know which was an expensive gift and which was a more modest one. No one would feel ashamed of their gift and everyone would share in the joy of giving to others.

**In keeping with the spirit of the first White Gift service all those attending bring a gift wrapped in white paper to be given to someone in need.**

Some suggestions from the Volunteer Center and for our own pantry are pastas and sauces, cereal, canned meat, canned milk, canned fruits and canned vegetables. It is also suggested that gift cards from places such as Burger King, McDonalds or Tim Hortons could be placed in small boxes and gift wrapped for children. They love to unwrap something at Christmas.



## SCRIPTURE READINGS – New International Version

### Isaiah 2:1-5

**1** This is what Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem:

**2** In the last days the mountain of the Lord's temple will be established as the highest of the mountains; it will be exalted above the hills, and all nations will stream to it.

**3** Many peoples will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the temple of the God of Jacob. He will teach us his ways, so that we may walk in his paths."

The law will go out from Zion, the word of the Lord from Jerusalem.

**4** He will judge between the nations and will settle disputes for many peoples.

They will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks.

Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war anymore.

**5** Come, descendants of Jacob, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

### Romans 13:11-14 NIV

**11** And do this, understanding the present time: The hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed.

**12** The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armour of light.

**13** Let us behave decently, as in the daytime, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery, not in dissension and jealousy.

**14** Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the flesh.

### Matthew 24:36-44

**36** "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.

**37** As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man.

**38** For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark;

**39** and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man.

**40** Two men will be in the field; one will be taken and the other left.

**41** Two women will be grinding with a hand mill; one will be taken and the other left.

**42** "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come.

**43** But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch and would not have let his house be broken into.

**44** So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him.
