SCRIPTURE READINGS – New International Version

Isaiah 35:1-10

NIV

- 1** The desert and the parched land will be glad; the wilderness will rejoice and blossom. Like the crocus,
- 2** it will burst into bloom; it will rejoice greatly and shout for joy. The glory of Lebanon will be given to it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they will see the glory of the LORD, the splendour of our God.
- 3** Strengthen the feeble hands, steady the knees that give way;
- 4** say to those with fearful hearts, "Be strong, do not fear; your God will come, he will come with vengeance; with divine retribution he will come to save you."
- 5** Then will the eyes of the blind be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped.
- 6** Then will the lame leap like a deer, and the mute tongue shout for joy. Water will gush forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert.
- 7** The burning sand will become a pool, the thirsty ground bubbling springs. In the haunts where jackals once lay, grass and reeds and papyrus will grow.
- 8** And a highway will be there; it will be called the Way of Holiness; it will be for those who walk on that Way. The unclean will not journey on it; wicked fools will not go about on it.
- 9** No lion will be there, nor any ravenous beast; they will not be found there. But only the redeemed will walk there,
- 10** and those the LORD has rescued will return. They will enter Zion with singing; everlasting joy will crown their heads. Gladness and joy will overtake them, and sorrow and sighing will flee away.

James 5:7-10

NIV

- 7** Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains.
- 8** You too, be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near.
- 9** Don't grumble against one another, brothers and sisters, or you will be judged. The Judge is standing at the door!
- 10** Brothers and sisters, as an example of patience in the face of suffering, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

Matthew 11:2-11

NIV

- 2** When John, who was in prison, heard about the deeds of the Messiah, he sent his disciples
- 3** to ask him, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we expect someone else?"
- 4** Jesus replied, "Go back and report to John what you hear and see:
- 5** The blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor.
- 6** Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of me."
- 7** As John's disciples were leaving, Jesus began to speak to the crowd about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swayed by the wind?
- 8** If not, what did you go out to see? A man dressed in fine clothes? No, those who wear fine clothes are in kings' palaces.
- 9** Then what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet.
- 10** This is the one about whom it is written: "'I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.'
- 11** Truly I tell you, among those born of women there has not risen anyone greater than John the Baptist; yet whoever is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.
