Thanksgiving is a national civic holiday in Canada that is celebrated on the second Monday of October. It was established by a government decree in 1859 and then became an annual event in 1879—with varying dates and themes.

The reason behind celebrating Thanksgiving is to honor life's blessings, to give thanks for a good harvest, and other fortunes, and to follow the traditions of Indigenous and Protestant cultures. The holiday is not *religious* per se, but rather a time for family and food.



Having said that, I respectfully disagree with the non-religious part. It's actually both! The celebration of thanksgiving, after all, can move Communities of Faith (like ours) to share an extra measure of care and compassion with those who struggle to find abundance in their lives. Some may suffer from a lack of food, others—from a lack of hope. The challenge for us being, to truly give from our abundance—from the *Spirit's* abundance—and share what we have with others. By baking bread for a hungry person, for instance, or offering an encouraging word to someone struggling from illness, *we are actually giving thanks*.

Something very familiar to us here. Something—we do well.

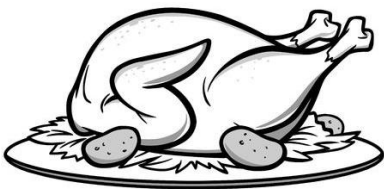
Community Outreach Team

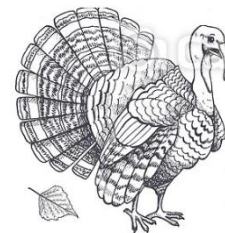

The next Ways and Means team event will hopefully take place in late November - a take-out only **TURKEY SUPPER**.

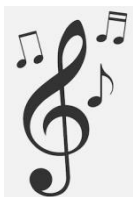


Annual Remembrance Service

Lester Scott was hired for the 2023 mowing season. A spring clean-up of the two cemeteries took place in May. A thank you is expressed to Gary Burke for hauling the leaves and to Donald Eddy for hauling tree limbs to the city dumping site for organic waste. A monument was straightened at the West Bathurst Cemetery with help from Donald Eddy. Additional mowing, weeding, and tree trimming were carried out during the summer, and topsoil was spread where needed at the West Bathurst Cemetery.

The cemetery records were updated. There were two burials/committals in 2023 to date.

Work still to be completed with volunteer help includes monument repair and removal of dead trees.

A special thank you is extended to everyone who continues to support the West Bathurst Cemetery Fund with their donations. The donations made up to August 31, 2023 total - \$1,025.
